ENVISION 2035 Comprehensive Plan Public Involvement Summary

Plan Process Timeline

- ⇒ Dec. 2011, County Commission appointed 14 rural residents, business owners, and agricultural producers to the Plan Task Force
- ⇒ In addition, an Advisory Board included local, state, regional, and industry representatives
- ⇒ Over a 2-3 year period, the Task Force met monthly to listen to a variety of speakers learning about important topics and fact gathering, brainstorm, discuss, and produce ideas for the Plan
- ⇒ In 2012, a series of 4 public meetings were held throughout the rural area with a combined attendance of 87 people to involve the county's residents and business owners in the development of the Plan
- ⇒ The final months were spent drafting the Plan incorporating input from the Task Force, Advisory Board, and members of the public to exemplify the future of Minnehaha County
- ⇒ In 2014 & 2015, 3 public open houses were held to gather feedback on a comprehensive plan draft document (25 total people in combined attendance)
